President and EducationJohn Sollows

John Sollows was born in Yarmouth and is a seventh-generation Yarmouthian. After graduating from high school, he attended Dalhousie University, where he earned a Master's Degree in Biology in 1976. John was a summer student during the Museum's first year on Collins Street in 1969. He is a life member of the Yarmouth County Historical Society and joined the board in 2005 as Education Chair. John spent most of his working life in aquaculture and fisheries development projects in seven countries in Africa and Asia. He returned to Yarmouth in 2004 with his wife (boss), Nguyen Thi Nhung of Pleiku, Viet Nam. Besides his work with the Society, John is a Director Emeritus of the Tusket River Environmental Protection Association, Secretary of the Southwest Nova Biosphere Reserve Association; Secretary of the Nova Scotia Heritage Fairs Society, serves on the Saint Ambrose Refugee Committee, helps others with immigration and settlement issues, and tutors kids, mostly in mathematics.

Michael Cunningham joined the Yarmouth County Historical Society in 2004 and became a member of the board in 2018. Mike was born in Yarmouth and his family first settled in the area around Cape Sable Island in 1785. Mike retired in 2018 after a 38 year career as a commercial pilot, the last 22 years of which was spent as an aircraft accident investigator. Herbert Cunningham, his grandfather, was chief Light-keeper at Cape Forchu Light Station between 1922 and 1952. His historical interests and research experience includes: lighthouses of southwestern Nova Scotia; Yarmouth in WWI; Yarmouth shipping and fishery history.

Past President and NominatingPeter Eldridge

Peter Eldridge was born in Saint John, N.B., spending his formative years there, living on the same street as the N.B. Museum. Peter is a retired high school teacher of English and related subjects and an administrator at Yarmouth Memorial High School (from 1965 - 1994), receiving a N.S. Provincial Community Volunteer Award in 1989 for activities in both the community and school. A long-time member of the Board of the Yarmouth County Museum, during the late 1900s he served as co-chair of fund-raising for the \$2.4 million expansion of the Museum and Archives. Since 2008, he has also been co-chair of the Yarmouth Area Community Fund, which assists all aspects of the community. A fan of historical connections, and avidly interested in the outstanding history of the Yarmouth area, for many years he provided a regular column in the monthly Museum newsletter (Historigram), titled "Celebrating Our History!". Peter was president of the Yarmouth County Historical Society from 2018 to 2020.

Ingrid Deon has been a member of the Yarmouth County Historical Society Board of Directors since 2017 and was the Assistant Director of the Yarmouth County Museum and Archives for nearly two years, from 2014 to 2015. Ingrid's interest in the history of Yarmouth County began when she worked at the Musée des acadiens des Pubnicos as a university student. Ingrid is one of only a few Acadians who is also a Mayflower descendant.

Assistant SecretaryCharles Webster

The Rev. Charles M. Webster is a Yarmouth native from a family with long-standing ties to the medical profession. He is Grandson of the 2nd President of this Historical Society, Dr. Charles A. Webster. His strengths and interests were never the sciences but History and Theology. He Graduated from Mount Allison University with his B.A and Major in History. He received his M.Div. from Emmanuel College U of T and initially ordained by the United Church of Canada and in 1991 received into the Reformed Church in America, the church the Dutch Loyalists left when they came to Tusket. He returned home in 2000 and became a Member of this Society shortly thereafter. He is intricately connected to the Doctor's Office in the Museum!!
